Born in Osaka, Japan in 1995, Tamaki started playing the piano at the age of three, followed by the cello at ten. At the age of sixteen, she was offered a place at The Yehudi Menuhin School in Surrey, England where she studied with Bartholomew LaFollette. Until then, she lived in Japan where she has won several competitions and prizes including 1st prize at All Japan Arts Competition 2010 and 2nd prize at The 21st Kobe International Music Competition 2016.

Her concert venues include The Wigmore Hall (London), The Menuhin Hall (Surrey), Milton Court Concert Hall (London), Château de Fontainebleau (France) and The Symphony Hall Osaka (Japan). She has taken parts in academies and festivals such as British Isles Music Festival, La Loingtaine Academy (France) and Menuhin Festival Gstaad (Switzerland) and Académie de Musique Française de Kyoto (Japan). She has also participated in masterclasses with musicians such as Heinrich Schiff, Philippe Müller, Raphael Bell and Rebecca Gilliver as well as appearing on performances with musicians including Alina Ibragimova, Yura Lee and Sreten Krstic.

She is currently studying at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London with Pierre Doumenge, on a scholarship generously supported by the institution. Her upcoming concerts include a new-commission work performance at Wigmore Hall, recital at CasaVerdi in Milan, Italy and Nagaokakyo Ensemble Concert Series in Kyoto, Japan.
